✓ LADY BLUES HOSTING OPENING ROUND OF BIG DANCE: The Washburn Lady Blues earned a automatic bid in the NCAA Division II South Central Region tournament, announced March 9 by the NCAA. Washburn enters the field as the No. 1 seed and will host the event in Lee Arena. The Lady Blues will face Midwestern (Texas) State in the opening round Friday at 8 p.m.

Midwestern State earned an at-large berth and finished second in the Lone Star Conference South Division. The Lady Indians fell 52-40 in the Lone Star Conference Tournament semifinals Friday night in Tahleguah, Okla.

Northeastern State won the Lone Star Conference's automatic bid by winning the conference tournament, while St. Mary's won the Heartland Conference tournament title and also earned an automatic besth

Missouri Western and Emporia State will face off in the first round and gained at-large bids from the MIAA, while Angelo State of the Lone Star Conference and Drury of the Heartland Conference also earned at-large bids.

The winner of the South Central Region will advance to the Elite Eight March 26, 27 and 29 at the St. Joseph Civic Arena in St. Joseph, Mo. For the first time ever, the field for 2003 NCAA Division II basketball tournaments expanded from 48 to 64 teams.

✓ **WASHBURN IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT:** Washburn is 6-6 in NCAA Division II playoff games, falling in the regional finals of the South Central Region to the Missouri Western Griffons in their last NCAA South Central Regional Tournament in 1994-95.

- ✓ WASHBURN LAST TIME OUT AT SONIC MIAA TOURNAMENT: KANSAS CITY, Mo. -- The Washburn Lady Blues gained a measure of revenge against defending conference postseason champion Missouri Western on Sunday, winning a rematch of last season's title game, 71-60, in the finals of the 2003 Sonic/Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association Women's Basketball Championship at Municipal Auditorium.

Washburn gains the MIAA's automatic berth in the NCAA Division II Tournament with the win. Tournament Most Valuable Player Crystal Walker scored 19 of her team-high 21 points in the second half to propel the Lady Blues to their first MIAA postseason championship since 1993. Western lost for the fifth time in six postseason tournament finals appearances dating back to 1998.

Walker, a senior forward from Osawatomie, Kan., was in foul trouble early and played only four minutes of the first half. Senior F Carissa Goeglein and senior G Gosia Czarnecka combined for seven points in a 10-0 run to put Washburn ahead, 20-10, with 3:55 to go in the half. Before the spurt, the Lady Blues had gone nearly eight minutes without scoring. The Lady Blues returned the favor on

defense, holding the Griffons scoreless for more than 12 minutes.

Western would finish the half on an 8-2 run to slice the deficit to four, 22-18, at the break. The two squads combined to shoot 24.5 percent (12-of-49).

Walker scored four as Washburn opened the second half with nine straight points to build its lead back to double figures. Western was within six of the lead on three occasions afterward, but could get no closer.

Senior F Steph Jones, a transfer from Nebraska to Western this season, was 5-of-9 from three-point range and led all scorers with 23 points (17 coming in the second half). Senior C Nicole Lindsey added 20 points with 10 rebounds.

Senior G Kristy Chapman added 14 off the Washburn bench, going 4-of-6 from beyond the arc, while Goeglein chipped in 12.

Walker was joined on the All-Tournament Team by sophomore G Lora Westling of Washburn, Jones and Lindsey from Western, and senior F Kristie McClain of Emporia State.

✓ LADY BLUES LAST TIME IN SOUTH CENTRAL REGIONAL AGAINST SOUTHEASTERN OKLAHOMA MARCH 7, 2002:

ST. JOSEPH, MO - The Washburn Lady Blues, playing in their first NCAA Regional Tournament since 1994-95, fell in the quarterfinals to Southeastern Oklahoma 63-50. The loss ended the Lady Blues' season with a 23-7 record - an 10-win improvement over the previous season's 13-14 record. The 10-win turnaround was the second best single-season improvement in school history.

The Lady Blues jumped out to a 13-8 lead, but the Lady Savages would cut the lead and eventually take a 25-24 lead. Over the next three minutes, Southeastern would go on a 11-2 run and take a 38-28 lead into the halftime break.

In the second half, the Lady Blues struggled from the field hitting only 5 of 21 field goal attempts, not getting closer than nine points with 13:18 remaining.

Junior Crystal Walker led the Lady Blues with 16 points. Classmate Carissa Goeglein scored 12. Sophomore Lora Westling pulled down a new career high eight rebounds, two more than her previous high.

It was also the final game for senior Jovanae St. Cyr who scored four points and recorded three rebounds. Fellow senior Lindsey Moddelmog was 1 of 1 from the field scoring two points and Sharina Watkins was scoreless not taking a shot.

✓ WALKER EARNED SECOND MVP AWARD AND IS NAMED DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE

YEAR: KANSAS CITY, Mo. — Crystal Walker, a 6-foot senior forward from Osawatomie, Kan., was named MIAA Most Valuable Player March 2 at the MIAA Media Welcome Reception. Walker was fourth in the MIAA in scoring with 15.8 points a game, seventh in rebounding (7.1 rpg) and fourth in field goal percentage (49.3 percent). She also earned MIAA Player of the Week honors twice this season

On Jan. 18 earlier this season Walker became the 16th Washburn player to reach the 1,000 point plateau by netting 22 of her 24 points in the second half of a comeback win against Central Missouri State in Lee Arena. She also grabbed her 500th rebound against Northwest Missouri State on Jan. 15.

Walker is the first player to win back-to-back MIAA Most Valuable Player awards since Aneta Kausaite of Emporia State shared the award in 1996-97 and won the award again in 1997-98. She is the only Washburn Lady Blue to win MIAA MVP honors twice.

Walker also was a member of the MIAA's Inaugural All-Defensive Team and was selected as the MIAA Defensive Player of the Year.

Carissa Goeglein earned second team All-MIAA honors by averaging 13.1 points and 5.0 rebounds a game. Goeglein, a 5-11 junior from Yuma, Colo. was also a first team All-MIAA selection as a junior in 2001-02.

WALKER ALSO NAMED ALL-REGION TEAM BY DAKTRONICS AND WBCA ALL-AMERICAN FINALIST.: TOPEKA — Crystal Walker, a 6-foot senior forward from Osawatomie, Kan., was named to the Daktronics-CoSIDA All-South Central Region first team March 11. Walker was fifth in the MIAA in scoring with 15.8 points a game, sixth in rebounding (6.9 rpg) and fourth in field goal percentage (49.1 percent). She also shared MIAA Most Valuable Player honors and was the Sonic MIAA Tournament MVP.

Walker scored 19 of her 21 points in the second half of the Sonic MIAA Tournament championship game Sunday in Washburn's 71-60 win over Missouri Western.

Walker is also a finalist for the WBCA All-America team.

With the honor McHenry becomes one of eight finalists for the Russell Athletic/WBCA National Coach of the Year, which will be presented Monday April 7 during the NCAA Division I women's Final Four weekend in Atlanta, Ga.

✓ **HEAD COACH RON MCHENRY:** Ron McHenry is in his third season on the bench for the Lady Blues, posting a 63-24 (.724) career record since being named the head coach on May 8, 2000.

He became only the fifth coach in the history of the women's basketball program at Washburn and the first new head coach since Dick joined the Lady Blues as the head coach in the 1977-78 season.

In only his second season as a head coach, McHenry engineered one of the best turnarounds in NCAA Division II, guiding Washburn to a regional berth and a 23-7 record. McHenry guided the Lady Blues to his first 20-win season last year after posting a 13-14 mark in his first season as Lady Blues head coach.

Prior to his appointment, McHenry spent the previous 11 seasons as a member of the men's basketball coaching staff under current coach Bob Chipman. While on the Washburn bench, he was a part of 243 wins. In addition to his basketball duties, McHenry was the men's golf coach for eight seasons.

McHenry has had a diverse coaching career. He began his career as a graduate assistant to Chipman during the 1984-85 season. He then went on to Perry High School in 1986 where he served as assistant boys coach.

McHenry quickly moved up the coaching ranks in 1988 when he assumed an assistant's position with the Topeka Sizzlers of the Continental Basketball Association. McHenry eventually became the Sizzlers' interim head coach before joining the Washburn staff for the 1989-90 campaign. During his first year on the

Washburn staff, McHenry was the department's academic advisor.

McHenry played for Washburn after stints at Coffeyville Community College and the University of Kansas. He started for the Ichabods during the 1983-84 season.

He graduated from Washburn with a bachelor's degree in communications and went on to earn a master's degree in sports administration from Wichita State University in 1987.

McHenry and his wife, Mischa, have three children, Danielle, Samantha and Ronnie. Danielle played one season of volleyball for the University of Kansas and transferred this season to Washburn and was named to the All-MIAA first team as a Lady Blue and is also on the Lady Blue basketball squad.

✓ LADY BLUES IN LEE ARENA: In their 18th season in Lee Arena, the Lady Blues are 227-52 (.814) overall at home. The longest winning streak was 44 games from Dec. 1, 1990 to March 20, 1993.

The Lady Blues were 15-1 in Lee Arena last season, outscoring opponents by an average of 75.6 to 59.9 (1209-959 points). Washburn's current home court winning streak is the longest since March 13, 1993, when Washburn won its 44th straight home game after capturing the South Central Regional Title 75-62 over Missouri Southern.

Washburn won 19 straight games in Lee Arena before falling to Missouri Western 60-56 Jan 29, 2003. The last lost prior was 69-67 to Missouri Western on Jan. 2, 2002 in the MIAA opener last season.

✓ **LADY BLUES HISTORY:** Washburn is 544-307 (.639) in its 33rd season of intercollegiate action.

✓ LATEST WBCA POLL (MARCH 12):

The Washburn Lady Blues moved up to No. 8 in the WBCA National Poll after entering the top 25 for the first time since 1997-98 earlier this season.

The team received its first national ranking in the WBCA Division II Women's National Poll since the 1997-98 season, when it entered the poll in a tie for No. 24 in Dec. 11, 2002 poll released by the Women's Basketball Coaches Association.

The ranking was Washburn's first since Dec. 27, 1997, when the squad opened the season with a 6-0 record to obtain a No. 19 national ranking. The Lady Blues lost five straight games after the 6-0 start in 1997-98 and had not been in the WBCA National Poll until this season.

✓ **TURNING UP THE D:** Under coach Ron McHenry the past two seasons, the Lady Blue trademark has been defense.

The Lady Blues **led** the MIAA and were **24th** in the nation last season by holding opponents to **58.6** points a game, while improving even further this season.

As of statistics on March 2, 2003, Washburn **led** the MIAA and was **10th** in the nation by holding opponents to **56.0** points a game.

✓ LADY BLUES MAKING GOOD ON CHARITIES: The Lady Blues were 9th in the NCAA in free throw percentage (76.7) statistics as of

Washburn has hit 81.8 percent in their 11-game winning streak. Bethany McGraw has hit 34 of 35 free throws during that stretch and has hit her last 16 attempts. Dan McHenry has hit her last 14 free throws.
