Washburn at UNK Classic

✓ **THE GAME:** The Washburn Lady Blues (2-0) will take on Bemidji (Minn.) State (0-1) Friday at 3 p.m., before taking on host Nebraska-Kearney (1-1) 5 p.m. Saturday night.

✓ **LADY BLUES ON RADIO:** The games will be broadcast in northeast Kansas on KWIC 99.3 Topeka, Kansas, with Ron Simon and Curtis Kitchen calling the action. Simon is in his 14th season as the play-by-play man for the Ichabods and Lady Blues. The Washburn coaches show is at McB's Sports Bar on Thursday's from 6-7 p.m and can be heard on KMAJ 1440 AM.

✓ **THE COACHES:** Ron McHenry is in his second season on the bench for the Lady Blues, posting a 15-14 (.517) career record.

McHenry was named the head coach on May 8, 2000, taking over for Patty Dick, who retired in April.

He became only the fifth coach in the history of the women's basketball program at Washburn and the first new head coach since Dick joined the Lady Blues as the head coach in the 1977-78 season.

McHenry led Washburn to a 13-14 record in his first season, which was also his first season as a head coach at the collegiate level.

Prior to his new appointment, McHenry spent the previous 11 seasons as a member of the men's basketball coaching staff under current coach Bob Chipman. While on the Washburn bench, he was a part of 243 wins. In addition to his basketball duties, McHenry was the men's golf coach for eight seasons.

McHenry has had a diverse coaching career. He began his career as a

graduate assistant to Chipman during the 1984-85 season. He then went on to Perry High School in 1986 where he served as assistant boys coach.

McHenry quickly moved up the coaching ranks in 1988 when he assumed an assistant's position with the Topeka Sizzlers of the Continental Basketball Association. McHenry eventually became the Sizzlers' interim head coach before joining the Washburn staff for the 1989-90 campaign. During his first year on the Washburn staff, McHenry was the department's academic advisor.

McHenry played for Washburn after stints at Coffeyville Community College and the University of Kansas. He started for the Ichabods during the 1983-84 season.

He graduated from Washburn with a bachelor's degree in communications and went on to earn a master's degree in sports administration from Wichita State University in 1987.

McHenry and his wife, Mischa, have three children, Danielle, Samantha and Ronnie. Danielle is a freshman on the University of Kansas volleyball team.

Doreen Zierer is in her 12th season at Bemidji State, posting a 124-176 record.

Amy Stephens is in her seventh season at the helm of the Lopers, posting a 147-33 record.

✓ **ABOUT BSU:** Bemidji State enters the tournament with a 0-1 record after falling 89-52 at South Dakota State on Nov. 17. The Beavers finished the 2000-01 season at 3-24.

✓ **ABOUT NEBRASKA-KEARNEY:** Nebraska-Kearney enters the weekend tournament with a 1-1 record after competing in the Pioneer Premiere Tournament in Fort Worth, Texas.

In the opener, the Lopers fell 51-50

to the host Texas Woman's University. UNK responded in the second game with a 63-59 win against Abilene Christian University.

The Lopers own the NCAA Division II record for consecutive home victories, which currently stands at 86.

The Lopers have won six straight regular season RMAC crowns and have made six straight NCAA national tournament appearances.

✓ LADY BLUES LAST TIME OUT:

The Lady Blues coasted to a 92-50 victory over Baker University Tuesday night in Lee Arena.

The Lady Blues got off to another quick start, taking a 13-2 lead on Carissa Goeglein's layup just four minutes into the game. Goeglein later followed with eight straight points for Washburn and finished the opening half with 15 to help WU to a 50-24 lead.

The Lady Blues continued a torrid pace with a 9-0 run capped by Kristy Chapman's 3-pointer to take a 35-point lead with 17:25 left.

Goeglein led the Lady Blues with 19 points on 8 of 10 shooting from the field. Chapman finished with 14 points, Crystal Walker added 12 points and 10 rebounds, while Gosia Czarnecka came off the bench with 10 points with her second straight 4-for-4 field shooting performance.

✓ **SERIES NOTES:** Washburn and Bemidji State will meet for the first time ever Friday.

Washburn leads the all-time series against Nebraska-Kearney 17-11, but has not beaten the Lopers since a regular season sweep in 1988-89, when Washburn was in the CSIC.

Nebraska-Kearney won the last meeting, a 83-59 on Dec. 3, 1999 in Kearney, Neb.

✓ **LADY BLUES IN LEE ARENA:** In 17 seasons in Lee Arena, the Lady Blues are 201-50 (.801). The Lady Blues were 8-5 at home last season, The longest winning streak was 44 games from Dec. 1, 1990 to March 20, 1993.

✓ **LADY BLUES HISTORY:** Washburn is 484-276 (.637) in its 32nd season of intercollegiate action.

✓ WASHBURN TIP-INS:

- Washburn's 56.2% field goal percentage was its highest since a 34 of 58 performance (58.6%) in a 92-68 victory at Pittsburg State Feb. 12, 2000.

- With 92 points Tuesday, Washburn reached the 90-point plateau in consecutive games for the first time since 1992-93 season, when the Lady Blues beat William Jewell 91-51 and Doane 94-71 in back-to-back games. Washburn also opened the season with two 90-point performances for the first time in school history.

- After missing a start in the opener to snap a string of 27 straight, Bethany McGraw started for the Lady Blues against Baker Tuesday night.

- Washburn shot over 50% from the field in back-to-back games for the first time since games three and four last season. The Lady Blues shot 51.9% against Millersville, before shooting 52.5% against Fort Hays State.

- With a victory on Saturday, the Lady Blues won their third straight season opener and 19th in 20 tries in season openers. The 97-point total was also a

record for a season opener.

- Washburn won its 200th game at Lee Arena on Saturday against Southwestern College.

- Washburn held Southwestern to a 15-of-49 effort from the field (30.6%), which was the worst opponent's shooting mark since the Lady Blues held Lincoln to 20-of-66 (30.3%) shooting on Jan. 23, 1999 in Jefferson City, Mo.
