Washburn vs. MidAmerica Nazarene

✓ **THE GAME:** The Washburn Lady Blues (4-0) host MidAmerica Nazarene (3-4) in Lee Arena tonight.

✓ **LADY BLUES ON RADIO:** The games will be broadcast in northeast Kansas on KWIC 99.3 Topeka, Kansas, with Ron Simon and Curtis Kitchen calling the action. Simon is in his 14th season as the play-by-play man for the Ichabods and Lady Blues. The Washburn coaches show is at McB's Sports Bar on Thursday's from 6-7 p.m and can be heard on KMAJ 1440 AM.

✓ **THE COACHES:** Ron McHenry is in his second season on the bench for the Lady Blues, posting a 17-14 (.548) career record.

McHenry was named the head coach on May 8, 2000, taking over for Patty Dick, who retired in April.

He became only the fifth coach in the history of the women's basketball program at Washburn and the first new head coach since Dick joined the Lady Blues as the head coach in the 1977-78 season.

McHenry led Washburn to a 13-14 record in his first season, which was also his first season as a head coach at the collegiate level.

Prior to his new appointment, McHenry spent the previous 11 seasons as a member of the men's basketball coaching staff under current coach Bob Chipman. While on the Washburn bench, he was a part of 243 wins. In addition to his basketball duties, McHenry was the men's golf coach for eight seasons.

McHenry has had a diverse coaching career. He began his career as a graduate assistant to Chipman during the 1984-85 season. He then went

on to Perry High School in 1986 where he served as assistant boys coach.

McHenry quickly moved up the coaching ranks in 1988 when he assumed an assistant's position with the Topeka Sizzlers of the Continental Basketball Association. McHenry eventually became the Sizzlers' interim head coach before joining the Washburn staff for the 1989-90 campaign. During his first year on the Washburn staff, McHenry was the department's academic advisor.

McHenry played for Washburn after stints at Coffeyville Community College and the University of Kansas. He started for the Ichabods during the 1983-84 season.

He graduated from Washburn with a bachelor's degree in communications and went on to earn a master's degree in sports administration from Wichita State University in 1987.

McHenry and his wife, Mischa, have three children, Danielle, Samantha and Ronnie. Danielle is a freshman on the University of Kansas volleyball team.

Bill Olin is in his third season at the helm of the Lady Pioneers, owning a 31-38 record.

✓ **ABOUT MIDAMERICA NAZARENE:** The Pioneers are 3-4 after falling in overtime at Point Loma University on Nov. 17, having been out of action for 10 days.

Junior guard Tracy Hardee leads three Lady Pioneers averaging in double figures with 13.0 points and 3.9 rebounds a game. Kristen Jennings is averaging 12.0 points and 7.0 rebounds a game while tallying 17 blocks in seven games. Kelly Tucker averages 11.7 points and 4.7 rebounds a game.

✓ **LADY BLUES LAST TIME OUT:**
After watching a 12-point lead in

the second half slip by, the Washburn Lady Blues rallied from five points down in the final 44 seconds to beat host Nebraska-Kearney to win the UNK Thanksgiving Classic. Crystal Walker hit a layup with 2.5 seconds left on a set in bounds play to secure the 46-45 victory.

Washburn's victory snapped an 87-game home court winning streak for the Lopers, which was the longest in NCAA Division II history. The loss was the first at home for UNK since a 79-71 defeat against Northern State on Jan. 27, 1995.

After leading nearly the entire contest, Washburn watched its lead slip away when Nebraska-Kearney's Beth Swift made a layup to make it 40-38 with 4:52 to play. The Lopers rallied to take a 45-40 lead with 44 seconds left and looked to preserve the streak.

Carissa Goeglein pulled Washburn within 45-42 on a layup with 27 seconds left, before Kristy Chapman pulled Washburn within a point after a missed UNK free throw. The Lady Blues tied up the in bounds pass and took the ball on the alternate possession, setting up Walker's game winning layup.

Walker, the tournament MVP, led the way with 15 points. Goeglein also made the all-tournament team after netting eight points on the night.

Washburn topped Bemidji State 72-55 in the opener Friday night. Walker had two career highs with 25 points and 13 rebounds to net her third straight double-double.

✓ **SERIES NOTES:** Washburn leads the all-time series 3-0, winning the last meeting 82-55 during the 1996-97 season.

✓ **LADY BLUES IN LEE ARENA:**
In 17 seasons in Lee Arena, the Lady Blues are 201-50 (.801). The Lady

✓ **LADY BLUES HISTORY:** Washburn is 498-297 (.626) in its 33rd season of intercollegiate action.

✓ WASHBURN TIP-INS:

- Kristy Chapman reached the 500-point plateau with an 11-point performance against Nebraska-Kearney. She has currently has 504 career points.

- With her career high 25 point and 13 rebound performance vs. Bemidji State, Crystal Walker opened the season with three straight double-doubles.

- Washburn's 56.2% field goal percentage was its highest since a 34 of 58 performance (58.6%) in a 92-68 victory at Pittsburg State Feb. 12, 2000.

- With 92 points on Nov. 20, Washburn reached the 90-point plateau in consecutive games for the first time since 1992-93 season, when the Lady Blues beat William Jewell 91-51 and Doane 94-71 in back-to-back games. Washburn also opened the season with two 90-point performances for the first time in school history.

- In the victory over Baker, Washburn shot over 50% from the field in back-to-back games for the first time since games three and four last season. The Lady Blues shot 51.9% against Millersville, before shooting 52.5% against Fort Hays State.

- Washburn won its 200th game at Lee Arena on Saturday against Southwestern College.

- Washburn held Southwestern to a 15-of-49 effort from the field (30.6%), which was the worst opponent's shooting mark since the Lady Blues held Lincoln to 20-of-66 (30.3%) shooting on Jan. 23, 1999 in Jefferson City, Mo.
