✓ **THE GAME:** The Washburn Lady Blues (5-0) travel to St. Louis, Mo. to take on 2-3 Missouri-St. Louis.

✓ **LADY BLUES ON RADIO:** The games will be broadcast in northeast Kansas on KWIC 99.3 Topeka, Kansas, with Ron Simon and Curtis Kitchen calling the action. Simon is in his 14th season as the play-by-play man for the Ichabods and Lady Blues. The Washburn coaches show is at McB's Sports Bar on Thursday's from 6-7 p.m and can be heard on KMAJ 1440 AM.

✓ **THE COACHES:** Ron McHenry is in his second season on the bench for the Lady Blues, posting a 18-14 (.563) career record.

McHenry was named the head coach on May 8, 2000, taking over for Patty Dick, who retired in April.

He became only the fifth coach in the history of the women's basketball program at Washburn and the first new head coach since Dick joined the Lady Blues as the head coach in the 1977-78 season.

McHenry led Washburn to a 13-14 record in his first season, which was also his first season as a head coach at the collegiate level.

Prior to his new appointment, McHenry spent the previous 11 seasons as a member of the men's basketball coaching staff under current coach Bob Chipman. While on the Washburn bench, he was a part of 243 wins. In addition to his basketball duties, McHenry was the men's golf coach for eight seasons.

McHenry has had a diverse coaching career. He began his career as a graduate assistant to Chipman during the 1984-85 season. He then went

on to Perry High School in 1986 where he served as assistant boys coach.

McHenry quickly moved up the coaching ranks in 1988 when he assumed an assistant's position with the Topeka Sizzlers of the Continental Basketball Association. McHenry eventually became the Sizzlers' interim head coach before joining the Washburn staff for the 1989-90 campaign. During his first year on the Washburn staff, McHenry was the department's academic advisor.

McHenry played for Washburn after stints at Coffeyville Community College and the University of Kansas. He started for the Ichabods during the 1983-84 season.

He graduated from Washburn with a bachelor's degree in communications and went on to earn a master's degree in sports administration from Wichita State University in 1987.

McHenry and his wife, Mischa, have three children, Danielle, Samantha and Ronnie. Danielle is a freshman on the University of Kansas volleyball team.

Shelly Ethridge is in her fifth season at the helm of the Riverwomen, owning a 64-42 record.

✓ **ABOUT UMSL:** The Riverwomen are 2-3 after topping Lewis 71-51 on Saturday night. The Riverwomen have yet to leave the city limits of St. Louis, hosting five home games and traveling to St. Louis University for an exhibition.

✓ **UMSL LAST TIME OUT:** ST. LOUIS, MO – The UMSL women's basketball team marks their first Great Lakes Valley Conference win, beating Lewis University 71-51 Saturday afternoon. The win puts the Riverwomen to 2-3 overall and 1-2 in the conference.

The first half began with a 5-0 run

by the Riverwomen, which began with a three point shot by Chris Lane (Imperial, Mo./Seckman/UM-Rolla). The Flyer's gained the lead when Tracey Buchholz hit a three at the 17:17 mark. UMSL would trail for the next five minutes until Sophia Ruffin (Chicago, Ill./Rend Lake CC) ties the game at 13-13 with a three, but Lewis quickly responds to go up again by three. UMSL went on a 9-0 run to take the lead. A jumper from Lewis would put the Flyers within two, but UMSL would spark an 11-0 run with 6 points from Lane to enter the half with a 38-25 advantage. UMSL shot 46.4% from the field and averaged 44.4% from behind the arc.

In the second half, Lewis began to inch their way back into the game with a 6-0 run, but a foul by the Flyers would put it to a halt. Two jumpers by Jessica Woods (Coppell, TX/Texas Wesleyan College) and Larissa Cordiano (Melbourne, Australia/University of Wyoming) kept the Riverwomen leading by double digits. Lewis quickly hit two buckets to get within 16 points at the 7:15 mark, but would be as close as the Flyers would get the rest of the game. The Riverwomen hit free throws down the stretch to clinch their first conference victory 71-51.

UMSL was led in scoring by Christy Lane with 30 points, two blocks and four steals. Jessica Woods had a career high with 12 rebounds and Sophia Ruffin added 13 points. Larissa Cordiano also contributed a career high of nine points.

✓ LADY BLUES LAST TIME OUT:

The Lady Blues topped MidAmerica Nazarene 79-51 in Lee Arena Tuesday night.

Despite committing 16 turnovers and shooting 30 of 76 from the field (39.5%), Washburn opened a 40-23

lead to end the first half behind 10 straight points on four baskets by Kristy Chapman.

The Lady Pioneers pulled within 44-36 with 13:32 left, before Washburn responded 16-5 run to pull away with six minutes left.

Alison Garrett came off the bench to hit three straight 3-pointers to finish the game, including two in the final 50 seconds. Chapman finished with 20 points, while Crystal Walker added 14 and Carissa Goeglein 11 for the Lady Blues. Jovanae St. Cyr added a team-high 10 rebounds and seven points, including eight rebounds in the victory.

✓ **SERIES NOTES:** Washburn leads the all-time series 12-1, losing for the first time to the Riverwomen 59-51 on Dec. 30, 2000 in Lee Arena.

✓ **LADY BLUES IN LEE ARENA:** In 17 seasons in Lee Arena, the Lady Blues are 201-50 (.801). The Lady Blues were 8-5 at home last season, The longest winning streak was 44 games from Dec. 1, 1990 to March 20, 1993.

✓ **LADY BLUES HISTORY:** Washburn is 499-297 (.626) in its 33rd season of intercollegiate action.

✓ WASHBURN TIP-INS:

• Kristy Chapman reached the 500-point plateau with an 11-point performance against Nebraska-Kearney. She has currently has 524 career points.

• For her performance last weekend to earn UNK Thanksgiving Classic MVP, Crystal Walker was also named MIAA Player of the Week for the first time in her career.

• Washburn needs only one more victory to become the 28th team in NCAA Division II women's basketball history to with 500 games.
