Washburn vs. Northwest Missouri

✓ **THE GAME:** The Washburn Lady Blues (10-3, 3-2 MIAA) host Northwest Missouri State (7-6, 2-3 MIAA) tonight in Lee Arena.

Washburn is off to its best start since 1993-94, when the squad opened 11-3 and is looking to win four straight MIAA games for the first time since Jan. 23, 1999, when the Lady Blues capped a five-game winning streak.

✓ LADY BLUES ON RADIO: The game will be broadcast in northeast Kansas on KWIC 99.3 Topeka, Kansas, with Ron Simon and Curtis Kitchen calling the action. Simon is in his 14th season as the play-by-play man for the Ichabods and Lady Blues. The Washburn coaches show is at McB's Sports Bar on Thursday's from 6-7 p.m and can be heard on KMAJ 1440 AM.

✓ **THE COACHES:** Ron McHenry is in his second season on the bench for the Lady Blues, posting a 23-17 (.575) career record.

McHenry was named the head coach on May 8, 2000, taking over for Patty Dick, who retired in April.

He became only the fifth coach in the history of the women's basketball program at Washburn and the first new head coach since Dick joined the Lady Blues as the head coach in the 1977-78 season.

McHenry led Washburn to a 13-14 record in his first season, which was also his first season as a head coach at the collegiate level.

Prior to his new appointment, McHenry spent the previous 11 seasons as a member of the men's basketball coaching staff under current coach Bob Chipman. While on the Washburn bench, he was a part of 243 wins. In addition to his basketball duties, McHenry was the men's golf coach for eight seasons.

McHenry has had a diverse coaching career. He began his career as a graduate assistant to Chipman during the 1984-85 season. He then went on to Perry High School in 1986 where he served as assistant boys coach.

McHenry quickly moved up the coaching ranks in 1988 when he assumed an assistant's position with the Topeka Sizzlers of the Continental Basketball Association. McHenry eventually became the Sizzlers' interim head coach before joining the Washburn staff for the 1989-90 campaign. During his first year on the Washburn staff, McHenry was the department's academic advisor.

McHenry played for Washburn after stints at Coffeyville Community College and the University of Kansas. He started for the Ichabods during the 1983-84 season.

He graduated from Washburn with a bachelor's degree in communications and went on to earn a master's degree in sports administration from Wichita State University in 1987.

McHenry and his wife, Mischa, have three children, Danielle, Samantha and Ronnie. Danielle is a freshman on the University of Kansas volleyball team.

Gene Steinmeyer is in his third season at the helm of the Bearcats, complina a 23-43 overall record. Steinmeyer spent the previous 16 years at Doane (Neb.) College and has an overall record of 383-184.

✓ ABOUT THE BEARCATS: The Bearcats are 7-6 this season after dropping three straight MIAA contests, including an 85-72 loss to Missouri Southern in Maryville, Mo. Saturday night.

Brooke Hoque leads Northwest with 13.8 points a game, while Jerrica Miller is the only other Bearcat in double figures with 10.4 points a game.

✓ LADY BLUES LAST TIME OUT:

The Washburn Lady Blues struggled at times but held off the University of Missouri-Rolla Lady Miners 66-61 Saturday afternoon.

Despite committing a season high 26 turnovers, the Lady Blues forced the Lady Miners into 27 turnovers and a 37 percent field goal percetage in the 5-point win.

The Lady Blues trailed at halftime for the first time this season 33-32, but took the lead for good at 40-38 at the 15:10 mark on a jumper by Carissa Goeglein.

The Lady Blues would build their lead to as many as eight, but the Lady Miners would battle back to tie the score at 54 before Washburn would pull back away for the win.

Crystal Walker led the Lady Blues with her sixth double double of the season and eighth of her career with 19 points and 10 rebounds. Goeglein had 18 following up her career high 25 against Southwest Baptist last time out.

- For the first time this season, Washburn trailed at the half against Missouri-Rolla 33-32 Saturday.
- With an 85-53 win Thursday, Washburn won consecutive conference games by 20 points or more for the first time since Jan. 23, 1999, when it topped Lincoln 78-52 for a fourth straight win by 20 or more

points.

• With a win Saturday, Washburn won three straight conference games for the first time since Jan. 23, 1999 as well. The Lady Blues capped a string of five-straight MIAA victories that season vs. Lincoln.
