Washburn vs. Emporia State

✓ **THE GAME:** The Washburn Lady Blues (11-4, 4-3 MIAA) host Emporia State (9-6, 2-5 MIAA) Wednesday night in Lee Arena.

Washburn has not beaten the Hornets since a 68-67 victory in Emporia on Jan. 29, 1997 and is looking to snap a nine-game losing streak in the series. The Lady Blues have not beaten Emporia State in Lee Arena since an 81-75 win on Feb. 14, 1996.

✓ LADY BLUES ON RADIO: The game will be broadcast in northeast Kansas on KWIC 99.3 Topeka, Kansas, with Ron Simon and Curtis Kitchen calling the action. Simon is in his 14th season as the play-by-play man for the Ichabods and Lady Blues. The Washburn coaches show is at McB's Sports Bar on Thursday's from 6-7 p.m and can be heard on KMAJ 1440 AM.

✓ THE COACHES: Ron McHenry is in his second season on the bench for the Lady Blues, posting a 24-18 (.571) career record.

McHenry was named the head coach on May 8, 2000, taking over for Patty Dick, who retired in April.

He became only the fifth coach in the history of the women's basketball program at Washburn and the first new head coach since Dick joined the Lady Blues as the head coach in the 1977-78 season.

McHenry led Washburn to a 13-14 record in his first season, which was also his first season as a head coach at the collegiate level.

Prior to his new appointment, McHenry spent the previous 11 seasons as a member of the men's basketball coaching staff under current coach Bob Chipman. While on the Washburn bench, he was a part of 243 wins. In addition to his basketball duties, McHenry was the men's golf coach for

McHenry has had a diverse coaching career. He began his career as a graduate assistant to Chipman during the 1984-85 season. He then went on to Perry High School in 1986 where he served as assistant boys coach.

McHenry quickly moved up the coaching ranks in 1988 when he assumed an assistant's position with the Topeka Sizzlers of the Continental Basketball Association. McHenry eventually became the Sizzlers' interim head coach before joining the Washburn staff for the 1989-90 campaign. During his first year on the Washburn staff, McHenry was the department's academic advisor.

McHenry played for Washburn after stints at Coffeyville Community College and the University of Kansas. He started for the Ichabods during the 1983-84 season.

He graduated from Washburn with a bachelor's degree in communications and went on to earn a master's degree in sports administration from Wichita State University in 1987.

McHenry and his wife, Mischa, have three children, Danielle, Samantha and Ronnie. Danielle is a freshman on the University of Kansas volleyball team.

Brandon Schnieder is in his fourth season at the helm of the Lady Hornets, compling a 96-15 record. Before becoming ESU's head coach in 1998-99, he was an assistant for three season for the Lady Hornets.

✓ ABOUT THE LADY HORNETS:

The Lady Hornets are 9-6 and 2-5 in the MIAA after falling to Missouri Southern 62-60 in Joplin Saturday night. The Lady Hornets have lost more games this season than they had lost in any of the past four seasons to earn four straight MIAA crowns.

The Lady Hornets are led in scoring by freshman Nicole Patry with 12.2

points a game. Stephanie Riles and Ali Sprague average 11.3 and 10.5 points a game respectively.

✓ LADY BLUES LAST TIME OUT:

The Lady Blues couldn't get it going offensively, falling 58-51 at Central Missouri State Saturday night.

Washburn took an early 9-3 lead but faltered late to finish 17 of 60 (28.3%), which was a season low shooting percentage. The Lady Blues were 7 of 28 (25.0%) percent in the second half after trailing 34-32 at the half.

The Jennies led by as many as eight in the second half, before Washburn made one final push. Consecutive layups by Jovanae St. Cyr and Crystal Walker pulled Washburn within 54-51 with 54 seconds left.

CMSU connected on four free throws in the final seconds to pull away from Washburn and give the Jennies their fourth straight victory over Washburn in Warrensburg.

Crystal Walker was the only player in double figures with 16 points and nine rebounds.

 - With a win last Wednesday, Washburn won four

- straight conference games for the first time since Jan. 23, 1999 as well. The Lady Blues capped a string of five-straight MIAA victories that season vs. Lincoln.
- Washburn was ranked in the top 15 in the nation in several team categories in the NCAA Division II stats released last Monday. The Lady Blues were 13th in scoring defense (55.7 ppg), 13th in scoring margin (+15.8 ppg) and 17th in rebounding margin (+7.9 rpg).
