✓ **THE GAME:** The Washburn Lady Blues (12-4, 5-3 MIAA) host Pittsburg State (12-4, 6-2 MIAA) in Lee Arena Saturday night.

Washburn is off to its best start since the 1994-95 season, when the Lady Blues also opened 12-4 to begin the season. Washburn is looking to snap a six-game losing skid in Lee Arena against Pittsburg State and has lost 10 of the last 11 meetings in the series.

✓ **LADY BLUES ON RADIO:** The game will be broadcast in northeast Kansas on KWIC 99.3 Topeka, Kansas, with Ron Simon and Curtis Kitchen calling the action. Simon is in his 14th season as the play-by-play man for the Ichabods and Lady Blues. The Washburn coaches show is at McB's Sports Bar on Thursday's from 6-7 p.m and can be heard on KMAJ 1440 AM.

✓ **THE COACHES:** Ron McHenry is in his second season on the bench for the Lady Blues, posting a 25-18 (.581) career record.

McHenry was named the head coach on May 8, 2000, taking over for Patty Dick, who retired in April.

He became only the fifth coach in the history of the women's basketball program at Washburn and the first new head coach since Dick joined the Lady Blues as the head coach in the 1977-78 season.

McHenry led Washburn to a 13-14 record in his first season, which was also his first season as a head coach at the collegiate level.

Prior to his new appointment, McHenry spent the previous 11 seasons as a member of the men's basketball coaching staff under current coach Bob Chipman. While on the Washburn bench, he was a part of 243 wins. In addition to his basketball duties, McHenry was the men's golf coach for

McHenry has had a diverse coaching career. He began his career as a graduate assistant to Chipman during the 1984-85 season. He then went on to Perry High School in 1986 where he served as assistant boys coach.

McHenry quickly moved up the coaching ranks in 1988 when he assumed an assistant's position with the Topeka Sizzlers of the Continental Basketball Association. McHenry eventually became the Sizzlers' interim head coach before joining the Washburn staff for the 1989-90 campaign. During his first year on the Washburn staff, McHenry was the department's academic advisor.

McHenry played for Washburn after stints at Coffeyville Community College and the University of Kansas. He started for the Ichabods during the 1983-84 season.

He graduated from Washburn with a bachelor's degree in communications and went on to earn a master's degree in sports administration from Wichita State University in 1987.

McHenry and his wife, Mischa, have three children, Danielle, Samantha and Ronnie. Danielle is a freshman on the University of Kansas volleyball team.

Steve High is in his 13th season at the helm of the Gorillas, compiling a 225-123 record. High has taken five teams to the NCAA Regional Tournament and has captured two MIAA titles.

✓ **ABOUT THE GORILLAS:** The Gorillas are 12-4 and 6-2 in the MIAA after beating Southwest Baptist 58-49 Wednesday night behind Amanda Davied's 16 points. Pittsburg State has won three straight games and five of the last six.

The Gorillas are led in scoring by Kami Scrivner at 12.7 points a game and Katie Spieker 11.2 points a game.

Bethany Turnbull averages 8.1 points and a team-high 7.3 rebounds a game.

✓ LADY BLUES LAST TIME OUT:

The Lady Blues used a solid defensive effort in a 70-61 victory over arch-rival Emporia State in Lee Arena Wednesday night.

The win was Washburn's first in 10 games against the Lady Hornets, snapping a nine-game losing skid dating back to Washburn's 68-67 victory in Emporia Jan. 29, 1997.

After ESU scored the first basket of the game, Washburn went on a 15-4 run that was capped by Gosia Czarnecka's 3-pointer just six minutes in. Washburn led by as many as 14, before taking a 37-27 halftime lead.

The Lady Hornets pulled within five several times in the second half, but couldn't close the gap as Crystal Walker score 17 of her career-high tying 25 points in the second half. Walker also added a career-high 16 rebounds.

Lindsey Modelmog netted a season high nine points on 4 of 4 shootings, while Carissa Goeglein scored 11 points.

- The Lady Blues have held 19 straight opponents under 70 points, dating back to a 76-50 loss at Missouri Western on Feb. 17, 2001.

- Washburn is 10-0 this season when outshooting opponents from the field, while going 2-4 in games

when being outshot by opponents.

- With a win last Wednesday, Washburn won four straight conference games for the first time since Jan. 23, 1999 as well. The Lady Blues capped a string of five-straight MIAA victories that season vs. Lincoln.

- Washburn was ranked in the top 15 in the nation in several team categories in the NCAA Division II stats released last Monday (Jan. 14). The Lady Blues were 13th in scoring defense (55.7 ppg), 13th in scoring margin (+15.8 ppg) and 17th in rebounding margin (+7.9 rpg).
