✓ **THE GAME:** The Washburn Lady Blues (13-5, 6-4 MIAA) host Truman State (11-7, 4-6 MIAA) 5:30 Saturday night.

Washburn is riding a four-game home court winning streak into the game and has posted a 9-1 record in Lee Arena this season, outscoring opponents by an average of 75.9 to 58.0.

✓ **WALKER NAMED MIAA PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** Washburn forward Crystal Walker, a 6-foot junior from Osawatomie, Kan., was named MIAA Player of the Week Monday, averaging 25.5 points and 12 rebounds a game in two victories over in-state rivals Emporia State and Pittsburg State last week.

Walker tied a career-high with 25 points and grabbed a career-high 16 rebounds in Washburn's 70-61 victory Wednesday night over Emporia State, grabbing 11 offensive rebounds. She was 10-of-19 from the field and 5-of-6 at the foul line.

Walker had 17 points in the second half to help Washburn snap a nine-game losing against the Lady Hornets.

On Saturday Walker followed by notching a new career-high with 26 points and 12 rebounds in a 64-62 victory over Pittsburg State.

After scoring her second straight basket to put the Lady Blues up by two with 27 seconds, Walker had to pull some more magic after PSU tied it at 62. Walker took a pass near the free throw line, faked and scored a layup at the buzzer for the win.

She finished with 16 points in the second half and was 10-of-14 from the field and 6-of-6 from the foul line in the game. Washburn's win snapped a six-game losing skid to the Gorillas in Topeka.

Walker, who also won the MIAA Player of the Week award on Nov. 27, 2001 after winning MVP honors at the Nebraska-Kearney Thanksgiving Invitational, has now notched eight double-doubles this season. Walker also cracked Washburn's top 30 in career scoring on Saturday night.

✓ **LADY BLUES ON RADIO:** The game will be broadcast in northeast Kansas on KWIC 99.3 Topeka, Kansas, with Ron Simon and Curtis Kitchen calling the action. Simon is in his 14th season as the play-by-play man for the Ichabods and Lady Blues. The Washburn coaches show is at McB's Sports Bar on Thursday's from 6-7 p.m and can be heard on KMAJ 1440 AM.

✓ **THE COACHES:** Ron McHenry is in his second season on the bench for the Lady Blues, posting a 26-19 (.578) career record since being named the head coach on May 8, 2000.

He became only the fifth coach in the history of the women's basketball program at Washburn and the first new head coach since Dick joined the Lady Blues as the head coach in the 1977-78 season.

McHenry led Washburn to a 13-14 record in his first season, which was also his first season as a head coach at the collegiate level.

Prior to his new appointment, McHenry spent the previous 11 seasons as a member of the men's basketball coaching staff under current coach Bob Chipman. While on the Washburn bench, he was a part of 243 wins. In addition to his basketball duties, McHenry was the men's golf coach for eight seasons.

McHenry has had a diverse coaching career. He began his career as a graduate assistant to Chipman during the 1984-85 season. He then went on to Perry High School in 1986 where he served as assistant boys coach.

McHenry quickly moved up the coaching ranks in 1988 when he assumed an assistant's position with the Topeka Sizzlers of the Continental Basketball Association. McHenry eventually became the Sizzlers' interim head coach before joining the Washburn staff for the 1989-90 campaign. During his first year on the Washburn staff, McHenry was the department's academic advisor.

McHenry played for Washburn after stints at Coffeyville Community College and the University of Kansas. He started for the Ichabods during the 1983-84 season.

He graduated from Washburn with a bachelor's degree in communications and went on to earn a master's degree in sports administration from Wichita State University in 1987.

McHenry and his wife, Mischa, have three children, Danielle, Samantha and Ronnie. Danielle is a freshman on the University of Kansas volleyball team.

John Sloop is in his second season with the Bulldogs, posting a 20-24 (.455) record. Sloop was an assistant coach on the men's basketball team at Truman before taking over the women's program last season.

✓ **ABOUT THE BULLDOGS:** The Bulldogs are 11-7 and 4-6 in the MIAA after falling to Southwest Baptist 77-74 in over-

time in Kirksville on Wednesday night. Jennifer Perkins scored 21 points and grabbed eight rebounds, while Jessy Fletcher scored 17 points and added nine rebounds.

Perkins leads Truman and is second in the conference in scoring with 19.0 points a game, while grabbing 8.7 rebounds a game. Wendi Sobaski is averaging 11.9 points a game as the only other Bulldog in double figures.

✓ LADY BLUES AND BULLDOGS LAST TIME OUT:

KIRKSVILLE, MO - The Washburn Lady Blues lost a heartbreaker to Truman State 55-53 on a buzzer-beater Saturday in Kirksville. With the loss the Lady Blues fall to 7-3 and 0-2 in the MIAA.

After Crystal Walker tied the game at 53 on a pair of free throws, Truman's Robyn Gerber hit a nine-foot jumper in the lane with under a second left to clinch the game.

The Lady Blues led at the break 29-27 behind Carissa Goeglein's nine points and four rebounds.

In the second half, Washburn would open a lead as many as eight points with 8:29 left, but over the next five minutes the Bulldogs would go on a 11-2 to cut the Lady Blues' lead to one at 3:05.

The teams would then trade baskets and Truman would take the lead at 52-51 with 27 seconds remaining. Truman would make 1 of 2 free throw attempts after a WU foul. Walker would then tie the game leading to the winning jumper by Gerber.

The Lady Blues were led by Goeglein's 15 points.

✓ LADY BLUES LAST TIME OUT:

ST. JOSEPH, MO - The Washburn Lady Blues fell to the No. 2 ranked Missouri Western State College Griffons 72-64 on the road.

The Lady Blues led at the break 29 to 27, but Missouri Western opened the second half with a 11-3 run to take control of the game.

Carissa Goeglein led the Lady Blues with 20 points on 8 of 14 shooting. Crystal Walker scored 12 points.

Washburn shot 46 percent for the game and shot 51 percent in the second half hitting 15 of 29 shots, however the Lady Blues were hammered on the boards 35-27. Also in the second half the Griffons shot 19 of 22 from the free throw line compared to 3 of 6 for the Lady Blues. For the game the Lady Blues were 8 of 13 and the Griffons were 24 of 29.

✓ **LADY BLUES IN LEE ARENA:** In 17 seasons in Lee Arena, the Lady Blues are 209-51 (.804). The Lady Blues were 8-5 at home last season, The longest winning streak was 44 games from Dec. 1, 1990 to March 20, 1993.

✓ **LADY BLUES HISTORY:** Washburn is 507-301 (.627) in its 33rd season of intercollegiate action.

✓ WASHBURN TIP-INS:

- The Lady Blues have held opponents under 50% shooting for 23 straight games, dating back to last season when Pittsburg State was the last team to hit over 50% on a 26 of 50 (52%) performance on Feb. 10.

- After holding 20 straight opponents under 70 points, the Lady Blues surrendered a 72-64 loss at Missouri Western Wednesday night. Missouri Western was also the last team to break 70 points in 76-50 victory over Washburn on Feb. 17, 2001.

- Washburn is 11-0 this season when outshooting opponents from the field, while going 2-5 in games when being outshot by opponents.

- With a win last Saturday, Washburn won six of seven conference games for the first time since Jan. 29, 1997 when the Lady Blues won their sixth straight at Emporia State.

- Washburn was ranked in the top 15 in the nation in several team categories in the NCAA Division II stats released last Monday (Jan. 21). The Lady Blues were 13th in scoring defense (56.5 ppg), 19th in scoring margin (+14.1 ppg) and 29th in rebounding margin (+6.9 rpg).
