Washburn at Missouri Southern

✓ **THE GAME:** The Washburn Lady Blues (14-5, 7-4 MIAA) travel to Missouri Southern (15-4, 8-3 MIAA) for MIAA game Monday night.

Washburn is ranked No. 5 in the latest South Central Regional poll, while the Lady Lioins are No. 8 in the region. With a win Saturday night, the Lady Blues surpassed their win total from last season (13-14).

✓ LADY BLUES ON RADIO: The game will be broadcast in northeast Kansas on KWIC 99.3 Topeka, Kansas, with Ron Simon and Curtis Kitchen calling the action. Simon is in his 14th season as the play-by-play man for the Ichabods and Lady Blues. The Washburn coaches show is at McB's Sports Bar on Thursday's from 6-7 p.m and can be heard on KMAJ 1440 AM.

✓ **THE COACHES:** Ron McHenry is in his second season on the bench for the Lady Blues, posting a 27-19 (.587) career record since being named the head coach on May 8, 2000.

He became only the fifth coach in the history of the women's basketball program at Washburn and the first new head coach since Dick joined the Lady Blues as the head coach in the 1977-78 season.

McHenry led Washburn to a 13-14 record in his first season, which was also his first season as a head coach at the collegiate level.

Prior to his new appointment, McHenry spent the previous 11 seasons as a member of the men's basketball coaching staff under current coach Bob Chipman. While on the Washburn bench, he was a part of 243 wins. In addition to his basketball duties, McHenry was the men's golf coach for eight seasons.

McHenry has had a diverse coaching career. He began his career as a graduate assistant to Chipman during the 1984-85 season. He then went on to Perry High School in 1986 where he served as assistant boys coach.

McHenry quickly moved up the coaching ranks in 1988 when he assumed an assistant's position with the Topeka Sizzlers of the Continental Basketball Association. McHenry eventually became the Sizzlers' interim head coach before joining the Washburn staff for the 1989-90 campaign. During his first year on the Washburn staff, McHenry was the department's academic advisor.

McHenry played for Washburn after stints at Coffeyville Community College and the University of Kansas. He started for the Ichabods during the 1983-84 season.

He graduated from Washburn with a bachelor's degree in communications and went on to earn a master's degree in sports administration from Wichita State University in 1987.

McHenry and his wife, Mischa, have three children, Danielle, Samantha and Ronnie. Danielle is a freshman on the University of Kansas volleyball team.

Maryann Mitts is in her first season at the helm of the Lady Lions, posting a 15-4 record this season and a 98-61 in her six seasons as a collegiate head coach. Mitts was the head coach at Rockhurst for the previous five seasons.

✓ **ABOUT THE LADY LIONS:** The Lady Lions are 15-4 and 8-3 in the MIAA after winning 69-64 at Southwest Baptist Saturday night. Southern is riding a three-game winning streak into the ballgame.

The team's top scorer, Katie Gariss, has missed eight games due to injury before scoring 10 points off the bench Saturday night and averages 16.3 points and 6.8 rebounds on the season. Jacquie Rzeszut averages 15.0 points and 6.3 rebounds a game, while Jean Hurt averages 12.7 points a game.

✓ LADY BLUES AND LADY LIONS LAST TIME OUT:

The Washburn Lady Blues topped Missouri Southern 77-55 in Lee Arena for their first MIAA victory on Jan. 10.

After the Lady Lions opened with the first four points, Washburn went on a 17-0 run to grab a big lead on Crystal Walker's layup.

Washburn continued the run to take an early 24-8 lead. The Lady Blues took a 36-21 lead into the half, as Southern never pulled within 12 in the second half.

Crystal Walker notched her fifth double-double of the season with 17 points and 10 rebounds, while Jovanae St. Cyr and Carissa Goeglein added 13 and 12 respectively.

✓ LADY BLUES LAST TIME OUT:

The Washburn Lady Blues used an early hot-shooting performance to roll to an 82-58 victory over Truman State in Lee Arena Saturday night.

After Truman took an early lead, the Lady Blues responded with a 9-0 run and a capped a 10-0 run to take a 28-14 lead on Bethany McGraw's baseline jumper with 7:14 left in the first half.

Washburn finished the first half 19-of-33 (57.6%) from the field, including 6-of-12 3-point baskets to go ahead 49-30.

Washburn led by as many as 30 in the second half and finished the game 35-of-66 (53.0%) from the field. Carissa Goeglein led the Lady Blues for the second straight game offensively with 17 points. Kristy Chapman added 13, Latasha Moore had a career-high 12 and Maggie Diehl added 10 off the bench.

✓ **SERIES NOTES:** Tonight's game is the is the 50th meeting between the two schools, with Washburn owning a 28-21 edge in the series. Washburn has won the last two games in the series and seven of the last eight.

✓ LADY BLUES IN LEE ARENA: In 17 seasons in Lee Arena, the Lady Blues are 210-51 (.805). The Lady Blues were 8-5 at home last season, The longest winning streak was 44 games from Dec. 1, 1990 to March 20, 1993.

The Lady Blue are 10-1 in Lee Arena this season, outscoring opponents by an average of 76.5 to 58.0.

✓ WASHBURN TIP-INS:

- The Lady Blues have held opponents under 50% shooting for 24 straight games, dating back to last season when Pittsburg State was the last team to hit over 50% on a 26 of 50 (52%) performance on Feb. 10.
- After holding 20 straight opponents under 70 points, the Lady Blues surrendered a 72-64 loss at Missouri Western Wednesday night. Missouri Western was also the last team to break 70 points in 76-50 victory over Washburn on Feb. 17, 2001.
- Washburn is 12-0 this season when outshooting opponents from the field, while going 2-5 in games when being outshot by opponents.
- In Saturday's win over Truman, Washburn shot 50% or better 35-of-66 (53.0%) for the fifth time this season. Washburn has won all five games, when it has shot 50% or better.
- Washburn was ranked in the top 15 in the nation in several team categories in the NCAA Division II stats released last Monday (Jan. 21). The Lady Blues were 13th in scoring defense (56.5 ppg), 19th in scoring margin (+14.1 ppg) and 29th in rebounding margin (+6.9 rpg).
