Washburn at Emporia State

✓ **THE GAME:** The Washburn Lady Blues (19-5, 12-4 MIAA) travel to Emporia State (15-9, 8-8 MIAA) for a 5:30 p.m. contest Wednesday night.

Washburn is trying to win seven straight MIAA games for the first time since Feb. 5, 1994, when the squad capped a nine-game MIAA winning streak with an 82-45 victory over Central Missouri in Lee Arena. A win would also give Washburn its first seven-game winning streak since Dec. 28, 1999.

The Lady Blues are trying to snap a four-game losing skid at Emporia, dating back to Washburn's last victory 68-67 on Jan. 29, 1997. With a win earlier this season, Washburn snapped a nine-game losing skid in the series with the Lady Hornets.

✓ **LADY BLUES ON RADIO:** The game will be broadcast in northeast Kansas on KWIC 99.3 Topeka, Kansas, with Ron Simon and Curtis Kitchen calling the action. Simon is in his 14th season as the play-by-play man for the Ichabods and Lady Blues. The Washburn coaches show is at McB's Sports Bar on Thursday's from 6-7 p.m and can be heard on KMAJ 1440 AM.

✓ **THE COACHES:** Ron McHenry is in his second season on the bench for the Lady Blues, posting a 32-19 (.627) career record since being named the head coach on May 8, 2000.

He became only the fifth coach in the history of the women's basketball program at Washburn and the first new head coach since Dick joined the Lady Blues as the head coach in the 1977-78 season.

McHenry led Washburn to a 13-14 record in his first season, which was also his first season as a head coach at the collegiate level.

Prior to his new appointment, McHenry spent the previous 11 seasons as a member of the men's basketball coaching staff under current coach Bob Chipman. While on the Washburn bench, he was a part of 243 wins. In addition to his basketball duties, McHenry was the men's golf coach for eight seasons.

McHenry has had a diverse coaching career. He began his career as a graduate assistant to Chipman during the 1984-85 season. He then went on to Perry High School in 1986 where he served as assistant boys coach.

McHenry quickly moved up the coaching ranks in 1988 when he assumed an assistant's position with the Topeka Sizzlers of the Continental Basketball Association. McHenry eventually became the Sizzlers' interim head coach before joining the

Washburn staff for the 1989-90 campaign. During his first year on the Washburn staff, McHenry was the department's academic advisor.

McHenry played for Washburn after stints at Coffeyville Community College and the University of Kansas. He started for the Ichabods during the 1983-84 season.

He graduated from Washburn with a bachelor's degree in communications and went on to earn a master's degree in sports administration from Wichita State University in 1987.

McHenry and his wife, Mischa, have three children, Danielle, Samantha and Ronnie. Danielle is a freshman on the University of Kansas volleyball team.

Brandon Schnieder is in his fourth season at ESU, posting a 102-18 record. Before taking over as head coach, Schnieder was an assistant under former Lady Hornet coach Cindy Stein.

✓ **ABOUT THE LADY HORNETS:** The Lady Hornets are 15-9 and 8-8 in the MIAA after thumping Missouri Southern 84-58 in Emporia Saturday night. Nicole Patry led the Lady Hornets with 23, while Stephanie Riles added 19 points off the bench.

✓ LADY BLUES AND LADY HORNETS LAST TIME OUT:

TOPEKA.- The Washburn Lady Blues used a solid defensive effort in a 70-61 victory over arch-rival Emporia State in Lee Arena Jan. 23.

The win was Washburn's first in 10 games against the Lady Hornets, snapping a nine-game losing skid dating back to Washburn's 68-67 victory in Emporia Jan. 29, 1997.

After ESU scored the first basket of the game, Washburn went on a 15-4 run that was capped by Gosia Czarnecka's 3-pointer just six minutes in. Washburn led by as many as 14, before taking a 37-27 halftime lead.

The Lady Hornets pulled within five several times in the second half, but couldn't close the gap as Crystal Walker score 17 of her career-high tying 25 points in the second half. Walker also added a career-high 16 rebounds.

Lindsey Modellmog netted a season high nine points on 4 of 4 from the field, while Carissa Goeglein scored 11 points.

✓ LADY BLUES LAST TIME OUT:

TOPEKA - The Washburn Lady Blues sent their senior class out right with a 94-85 vic-

tory over Central Missouri State in Lee Arena on Senior Night Saturday.

Washburn ranked No. 6 in the South Central Region, pulled ahead 15-6 early on Maggie Diehl's layup just six minutes into the game. After Latasha Moore scored eight straight points in her first two minutes on the floor, Washburn led 29-12, before Central pulled within 48-35 at the half.

Central Missouri, ranked No. 7 in the region, got within six early in the second half, but Washburn pulled away behind Crystal Walker's 12 points and eight rebounds in the half.

With the win, Washburn avenged an earlier loss this season to the Jennies and won its sixth straight MIAA game for the first time since Feb 25, 1995. The win also assured Washburn at least a share of second in the conference. Washburn's 94-point total was also the most by

Walker finished with 21 points and 11 rebounds, while Carissa Goeglein led a group of five other Lady Blues in double figures with 14 points.

Missouri Southern shot exactly 50% on 23-of-46 shooting against the Lady Blues on Feb. 4.

• Washburn is 16-0 this season when outshooting opponents from the field, while going 2-5 in games when being outshot by opponents. Washburn is 1-0 when shooting the same percentage as opponents.

• Washburn is a perfect 7-0 when it has shot 50% or better.

• Washburn was ranked in the top 30 in the nation in two team categories in the NCAA Division II stats released last Monday (Feb. 11). The Lady Blues were 22nd in scoring defense (57.8 ppg), 25th in scoring margin (+12.5 ppg).

• Washburn is 14-0 when scoring at least 68 points this season.

• The Lady Blues are 6-0 in the month of February, winning
