Washburn vs. Emporia State

✓ **THE GAME:** The No. 2 seed Washburn Lady Blues (22-5) host the No. 6 Emporia State Lady Hornets (16-11) in the semifinals of the MIAA tournament Wednesday night. The Lady Blues have won nine straight games overall and nine straight in Lee Arena.

The Lady Blues have reached the semifinals of the MIAA tournament for the first time since 1994-95, when the squad finished second in the tournament on the way to its last 20-win season of 24-7. That season was also the last time Washburn made the NCAA Division II tournament.

Washburn is also looking to beat Emporia State three times in a season for the first time since 1983-84. The two schools have never met in the MIAA tournament.

✓ **NINE-GAME STREAK RANKS SECOND IN NCAA D-II:** With a 65-52 win over Southwest Baptist Monday night, Washburn won its ninth straight game. The nine-game streak is the second longest current winning streak in NCAA Division II. Washburn has outscored opponents 74.7 to 60.1 points a game during the streak. The current streak is the longest for Washburn since Feb. 25, 1995, when Washburn won nine-straight MIAA games. The last time Washburn won 10 straight was during the 1992-93 season, when Washburn opened 30-0, before losing in the quarterfinals of the NCAA Division II National Tournament.

✓ **WALKER NAMED MIAA PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** Crystal Walker, a 6-foot junior forward from Osawatomie, Kan., was named MIAA Player of the Week Monday, averaging 21 points and six rebounds a game to help the Lady Blues top two in-state rivals on the road last week. The wins helped Washburn secure a 20-win season for the first time since 1994-95.

She scored 21 points and grabbed six rebounds in Washburn's 79-70 victory at Emporia State, dropping 13 points on the Lady Hornets in the second half. She was 8-of-19 from the field and 5-of-5 at the foul line, helping Washburn snap a four-game losing skid vs. ESU at White Auditorium.

Walker followed with another 21 point and six rebound effort to help Washburn win 70-55 at Pittsburg State Saturday night. She scored 15 points in the second half to finish 9-of-17 from the field and 3-of-4 at the foul line, while moving into 21st on Washburn's all-time scoring list with 726 points.

With the win Washburn extended its winning streak to eight games, which is its longest

since the 1993-94 season. The Lady Blues also finished a sweep over Emporia State and Pittsburg State in the same season for the first time since 1992-93.

The honor was the third MIAA Player of the Week award for Walker this season. She won the MIAA Player of the Week award on Nov. 27, 2001 after earning UNK Thanksgiving Classic MVP honors and Jan. 28, 2001 after Washburn swept Emporia State and Pittsburg State at home.

Walker is also the first Lady Blue to win MIAA Player of the Week honors three times in one season. Laura Mueller (1990-91), Shelley Foster (1992-93) and Jennifer Butcher (1999-2000) each received MIAA Player of the Week honors twice in a season. Brenda Shaffer-Dahl received MIAA Offensive Player of the Week (*Both Offensive and Defensive Player of the Week honors awarded) honors in three weeks during the 1989-90 season.

✓ **LADY BLUES ON RADIO:** The game will be broadcast in northeast Kansas on KWIC 99.3 Topeka, Kansas, with Ron Simon and Curtis Kitchen calling the action. Simon is in his 14th season as the play-by-play man for the Ichabods and Lady Blues. The Washburn coaches show is at McB's Sports Bar on Thursday's from 6-7 p.m and can be heard on KMAJ 1440 AM.

✓ **THE COACHES:** Ron McHenry is in his second season on the bench for the Lady Blues, posting a 35-19 (.641) career record since being named the head coach on May 8, 2000.

He became only the fifth coach in the history of the women's basketball program at Washburn and the first new head coach since Dick joined the Lady Blues as the head coach in the 1977-78 season.

McHenry led Washburn to a 13-14 record in his first season, which was also his first season as a head coach at the collegiate level.

Prior to his new appointment, McHenry spent the previous 11 seasons as a member of the men's basketball coaching staff under current coach Bob Chipman. While on the Washburn bench, he was a part of 243 wins. In addition to his basketball duties, McHenry was the men's golf coach for eight seasons.

McHenry has had a diverse coaching career. He began his career as a graduate assistant to Chipman during the 1984-85 season. He then went on to Perry High School in 1986 where he served as assistant boys coach.

McHenry quickly moved up the coaching ranks in 1988 when he assumed an assistant's position with the Topeka Sizzlers of the

Continental Basketball Association. McHenry eventually became the Sizzlers' interim head coach before joining the Washburn staff for the 1989-90 campaign. During his first year on the Washburn staff, McHenry was the department's academic advisor.

McHenry played for Washburn after stints at Coffeyville Community College and the University of Kansas. He started for the Ichabods during the 1983-84 season.

He graduated from Washburn with a bachelor's degree in communications and went on to earn a master's degree in sports administration from Wichita State University in 1987.

McHenry and his wife, Mischa, have three children, Danielle, Samantha and Ronnie. Danielle is a freshman on the University of Kansas volleyball team.

Brandon Schneider is in his his fourth season at the helm of the Lady Hornets, posting a 103-20 record.

✓ **ABOUT THE LADY HORNETS:** The Lady Hornets are 16-11 after topping Central Missouri State 72-67 in Warrensburg, Mo. in the opening round of the MIAA tournament Monday night. Deena Holloway scored 24 points on 8-of-14 shooting, while Nicole Patry scored 22 points on 9-of-15 shooting.

Patry leads the Hornets this season with a 15.1 point and 4.6 rebound a game average, while Holloway has averaged 11.4 points and 5.7 rebounds a game.

✓ **LADY BLUES AND LADY HORNETS LAST TIME OUT:**

The Washburn Lady Blues secured second place and a No. 2 seed in the MIAA Tournament with a 79-70 victory over Emporia State at White Auditorium last Wednesday night.

The victory, which gave Washburn its first seven-game MIAA winning streak since 1994, gave Washburn a 20-win season for the first time since the 1994-95 season.

After scoring the first six points of the game, Washburn surrendered a 16-11 lead with 13:30 to play in the opening half. After the Lady Hornets made it 33-22, Washburn pulled within 33-28 at the half when Lora Westling capped a 6-0 run with a layup to help Washburn pull within 35-30 at the half.

The Lady Hornets led by as many as six in the second half before Washburn took a lead on Bethany McGraw's two free throws, making it 47-46 with 14:16 to play.

Washburn pulled away and led by as many as 10 down the stretch to secure the victory, behind Crystal Walker's 13-point effort in the second half. She finished with 21 in the game, while Kristy Chapman had 11 points and six assists.

TOPEKA.- The Washburn Lady Blues used a solid defensive effort in a 70-61 victory over arch-rival Emporia State in Lee Arena on Jan. 23.

The win was Washburn's first in 10 games against the Lady Hornets, snapping a nine-game losing skid dating back to Washburn's 68-67 victory in Emporia Jan. 29, 1997.

After ESU scored the first basket of the game, Washburn went on a 15-4 run that was capped by Gosia Czarnecka's 3-pointer just six minutes in. Washburn led by as many as 14, before taking a 37-27 halftime lead.

The Lady Hornets pulled within five several times in the second half, but couldn't close the gap as Crystal Walker score 17 of her career-high tying 25 points in the second half.

Walker also added a career-high 16 rebounds to play in the opening half. After the Lady Hornets made it 33-22, Washburn pulled within 33-28 at the half when Lora Westling capped a 6-0 run with a layup to help Washburn pull within 35-30 at the half.

✓ LADY BLUES LAST TIME OUT:

For the first time since the 1994-95 season, Washburn won an opening round MIAA tournament game with a 65-52 win over Southwest Baptist in Lee Arena Monday night.

The win snapped a six-game MIAA tournament losing skid for the Lady Blues, who capped their ninth straight victory overall and ninth in Lee Arena with the win.

Leading 40-37 with 14:14 to play, Washburn went on an 11-0 run capped by Carissa Goeglein's layup with 9:10 left to make it 51-37.

Goeglein led the way for Washburn with 19 points on 8-of-12 shooting from the field and nine rebounds, while Lora Westling came off the bench with eight points and five assists.

✓ **SERIES NOTES:** Tonight's game is the 22nd meeting between the two schools, with Washburn owning an 11-10 edge in the series. Washburn won the first two meetings this season with an 85-53 win in Bolivar on Jan. 10 and a 76-62 win on Feb. 6.

✓ **LADY BLUES IN LEE ARENA:** In 17 seasons in Lee Arena, the Lady Blues are 212-51 (.810). The Lady Blues were 8-5 at home last season. The longest winning streak was 44 games from Dec. 1, 1990 to March 20, 1993.

The Lady Blues are 14-1 in Lee Arena this season, outscoring opponents by an average of 75.8 to 60.0 (1137-900 points). Washburn's current nine-game home court winning streak is the longest since Feb. 28, 1994, when the Lady Blues beat Missouri-St. Louis 88-77 in the opening round of the MIAA tournament.

✓ **LADY BLUES HISTORY:** Washburn is 516-301 (.633) in its 33rd season of intercollegiate action.

✓ WASHBURN TIP-INS:

- The Lady Blues have held opponents from shooting over 50% from the field for 32 straight games, dating back to last season when Pittsburg State was the last team to hit over 50% on a 26 of 50 (52%) performance on Feb. 10. Missouri Southern shot exactly 50% on 23-of-46 shooting against the Lady Blues on Feb. 4.

- Washburn is 19-0 this season when outshooting opponents from the field, while going 2-5 in games when being outshot by opponents. Washburn is 1-0 when shooting the same percentage as opponents.

- Washburn is a perfect 8-0 when it has shot 50% or better.

- Washburn was ranked in the top 30 in the nation in two team categories in the NCAA Division II stats released last Monday (Feb. 18). The Lady Blues were 29th in field goal percentage (44.3%), 20th in scoring margin (+12.8 ppg).

- Washburn is 15-0 when scoring at least 68 points this season.

- The Lady Blues are 9-0 in the month of February, winning games by an average of 74.7 to 60.1.

- Washburn's 94-point total vs. CMSU (Feb. 16) was the most it had scored since a MIAA game since a 120-86 win over UMSL on Feb. 23, 1991. The Lady Blues also surrendered the most points in a game since an 89-85 overtime victory over Truman State.
