# Washburn at Missouri Western

✓ **THE GAME:** The No. 2 seeded Washburn Lady Blues (23-5) travel to St. Joseph, Mo. to face the No. 1 seeded Missouri Western Griffons (26-2) for the MIAA Tournament championship 7 p.m. Friday. The Griffons are also ranked No. 1 in the WBCA Division II National Poll and the South Central Region, while the Lady Blues are No. 5 in the regional poll.

The Lady Blues are in the MIAA Tournament championship game for the first time since March 4, 1995, when the Lady Blues lost 76-62 at Missouri Western.

The Griffons have won the last nine meetings against Washburn and have won the last nine meetings at MWSC Fieldhouse. The Griffons won 69-67 in Topeka on Jan. 2 and 72-64 in St. Joseph on Jan. 30 earlier this season. Western is also 4-0 against the Lady Blues in the MIAA Tournament, ending Washburn's season three of the last four years in the opening round of the MIAA Tournament in St. Joseph.

✓ PERFECT FEBRUARY RANKS WASHBURN SECOND IN NCAA D-II: With the win over Emporia State Wednesday night, Washburn won its 10th consecutive game to finish the month of February 10-0. The ten-game streak is the second longest current winning streak in NCAA Division II. Washburn has outscored opponents 74.4 to 60.0 points a game during the streak. The last time Washburn won 10 straight was during the 1992-93 season, when Washburn opened 30-0, before losing in the quarterfinals of the NCAA Division II National Tournament.

✓ WALKER NAMED MIAA PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Crystal Walker, a 6-foot junior forward from Osawatomie, Kan., was named MIAA Player of the Week Monday, averaging 21 points and six rebounds rebounds a game to help the Lady Blues top two in-state rivals on the road last week. The wins helped Washburn secure a 20-win season for the first time since 1994-95.

She scored 21 points and grabbed six rebounds in Washburn's 79-70 victory at Emporia State, dropping 13 points on the Lady Hornets in the second half. She was 8-of-19 from the field and 5-of-5 at the foul line, helping Washburn snap a four-game losing skid vs. ESU at White Auditorium.

Walker followed with another 21 point and six rebound effort to help Washburn win 70-55 at Pittsburg State Saturday night. She scored 15 points in the second half to finish 9-of-

17 from the field and 3-of-4 at the foul line, while moving into 21st on Washburn's all-time scoring list with 726 points.

With the win Washburn extended its winning streak to eight games, which is its longest since the 1993-94 season. The Lady Blues also finished a sweep over Emporia State and Pittsburg State in the same season for the first time since 1992-93.

The honor was the third MIAA Player of the Week award for Walker this season. She won the MIAA Player of the Week award on Nov. 27, 2001 after earning UNK Thanksgiving Classic MVP honors and Jan. 28, 2001 after Washburn swept Emporia State and Pittsburg State at home.

Walker is also the first Lady Blue to win MIAA Player of the Week honors three times in one season. Laura Mueller (1990-91), Shelley Foster (1992-93) and Jennifer Butcher (1999-2000) each received MIAA Player of the Week honors twice in a season. Brenda Shaffer-Dahl received MIAA Offensive Player of the Week (\*Both Offensive and Defensive Player of the Week honors awarded) honors in three weeks during the 1989-90 season.

▶ LADY BLUES ON RADIO: The game will be broadcast in northeast Kansas on KWIC 99.3 Topeka, Kansas, with Ron Simon and Curtis Kitchen calling the action. Simon is in his 14th season as the play-by-play man for the Ichabods and Lady Blues. The Washburn coaches show is at McB's Sports Bar on Thursday's from 6-7 p.m and can be heard on KMAJ 1440 AM.

✓ **THE COACHES:** Ron McHenry is in his second season on the bench for the Lady Blues, posting a 36-19 (.655) career record since being named the head coach on May 8, 2000.

He became only the fifth coach in the history of the women's basketball program at Washburn and the first new head coach since Dick joined the Lady Blues as the head coach in the 1977-78 season.

McHenry led Washburn to a 13-14 record in his first season, which was also his first season as a head coach at the collegiate level.

Prior to his new appointment, McHenry spent the previous 11 seasons as a member of the men's basketball coaching staff under current coach Bob Chipman. While on the Washburn bench, he was a part of 243 wins. In addition to his basketball duties, McHenry was the men's golf coach for eight seasons.

McHenry has had a diverse coaching career. He began his career as a graduate assistant to Chipman during the 1984-85 season. He then went on to Perry High School in 1986 where he served as assistant boys coach.

McHenry quickly moved up the coaching ranks in 1988 when he assumed an assistant's position with the Topeka Sizzlers of the Continental Basketball Association. McHenry eventually became the Sizzlers' interim head coach before joining the Washburn staff for the 1989-90 campaign. During his first year on the Washburn staff, McHenry was the department's academic advisor.

McHenry played for Washburn after stints at Coffeyville Community College and the University of Kansas. He started for the Ichabods during the 1983-84 season.

He graduated from Washburn with a bachelor's degree in communications and went on to earn a master's degree in sports administration from Wichita State University in 1987.

McHenry and his wife, Mischa, have three children, Danielle, Samantha and Ronnie. Danielle is a freshman on the University of Kansas volleyball team.

**Dave Slifer** is in his his seventh season at the helm of the Lady Griffons, posting a 160-51 record at Western and 340-81 overall record. He is 14-3 against Washburn, winning the last nine meetings.

✓ **ABOUT THE GRIFFONS:** The Griffons are 26-2 after pummeling Missouri Southern 80-45 in St. Joseph, Mo. in the MIAA Tournament semifinals Wednesday night. Lakesha Jones led the Griffons with a careerhigh 29 points, while Carliss Holland added 10 points and 10 assists to set the school record for assists in a season at 171.

Jones leads a group of four Griffons in double figures with 11.6 points. Krista Small averages 11.1, Holland 11.0 and JoAnna Stuelke 10.0 points a game for the Griffons. Nicole Lindsey averaged 19.1 and 8.1 rebounds a game, but has missed the last three games and 11 of the last 12 games with a broken right foot.

## ✓ LADY BLUES AND GRIFFONS LAST TIME OUT:

ST. JOSEPH, MO - The Washburn Lady Blues fell to the No. 2 ranked Missouri Western College Griffons 72-64 on the road on Jan. 30

The Lady Blues (13-5, 6-4 MIAA) led at the break 29 to 27, but Missouri Western (17-1, 9-1 MIAA) opened the second half with a 11-3 run to take control of the game.

Carissa Goeglein led the Lady Blues with 20 points on 8 of 14 shooting. Crystal Walker scored 12 points.

Washburn shot 46 percent for the game and shot 51 percent in the second half hitting 15 of 29 shots, however the Lady Blues were hammered on the boards 35-27. Also in the second-half the Griffons shot 19 of 22 from the free throw line compared to 3 of 6 for the Lady Blues. For the game the Lady Blues were 8 of 13

#### ✓ LADY BLUES AND GRIFFONS ON JAN. 2:

TOPEKA.- The Washburn Lady Blues rallied but fell short 69-67 to No. 5 Missouri Western in Lee Arena on Jan. 2.

After trailing 62-51 with eight minutes left, Washburn pulled within 68-67 on Crystal Walker's layup with 42 seconds left.

After a Griffon missed shot, the Lady Blues had a chance to take the lead with just seconds remaining but Kristy Chapman's shot fell off hard.

The Lady Blues had four starters in double figures led by Chapman and Carissa Goeglein who had 14 apiece. Nicole Lindsey led Missouri Western with 22 points and 10 rebounds.

#### ✓ LADY BLUES LAST TIME OUT:

TOPEKA — After a cold-shooting start in the first half, Washburn caught fire in a 72-59 win over Emporia State in the MIAA Tournament semifinals Wednesday night in Lee Arena. The win snapped a 13-game MIAA Tournament winning streak for the Hornets, who won the previous four MIAA Tournament titles.

The win gave Washburn its first MIAA Tournament finals berth since March 4, 1995, when the Lady Blues lost 76-62 to Missouri Western in St. Joseph, Mo.

The Lady Blues got off to a rough start, trailing by as many as six points in three stretches in the first half by shooting 6-of-29 (20.7%) from the field.

Washburn responded in a big way, behind three-time MIAA Player of the Week foward Crystal Walker. Walker scored all her her 22 points on the night in the second half on 7-of-10 shooting from the field.

Carissa Goeglein's free throws with 9:51 to play capped a 13-2 run for the Lady Blues, who finished 29-of-44 from the foul line in the game. Their 44 free throws attempted was one shy of the school record. The Lady Blues shot 14-of-23 (60.9%) in the second half.

Walker finished with 22 points and eight rebounds, while Goeglein added 18 points and 10 rebounds to record her second career double-double. Nicole Patry countered with 28 points for the Lady Hornets.

**✓ SERIES NOTES:** Tonight's game is the 22nd meeting between the two schools, with Washburn owning an 11-10 edge in the series. Washburn won the first two meetings this season with an 85-53 win in Bolivar on Jan. 10 and a 76-62 win on Feb. 6.

✓ LADY BLUES IN LEE ARENA: In 17 seasons in Lee Arena, the Lady Blues are 214-51 (.808). The Lady Blues were 8-5 at home last season, The longest winning streak was 44 games from Dec. 1, 1990 to March 20, 1993.

The Lady Blues are 15-1 in Lee Arena this season, outscoring opponents by an average of 75.6 to 59.9 (1209-959 points). Washburn's current ten-game home court winning streak is the longest since March 13, 1993, when Washburn won its 44th straight home game after capturing the South Central Regional Title 75-62 over Missouri Southern.

✓ **LADY BLUES HISTORY:** Washburn is 517-302 (.631) in its 33rd season of intercollegiate action.

### **✓ WASHBURN TIP-INS:**

- The Lady Blues have held opponents from shooting over 50% from the field for 33 straight games, dating back to last season when Pittsburg State was the last team to hit over 50% on a 26 of 50 (52%) performance on Feb. 10.
